What is Sponsor Liaison?

The RSPCA is a non government, community based charity. Our primary concern is for the welfare of all animals - great and small.

The RSPCA costs millions of dollars every year and no matter how much money we raise or how much work our fantastic volunteers do, there is always more that needs to be done.

Every year, volunteers and staff approach businesses and individuals to donate goods and services for use in raffles, events and promotion.

The vision is to develop a team of Sponsor Liaison Volunteers to manage relations with businesses and individuals who donate goods and services. The long-term goal is to develop a prize pool for all shelters to draw from.

While large sponsors are managed through the Marketing and Promotions Department, the role of Sponsor Liaison is to develop mutually-beneficial relationships with Tasmanian businesses and to encourage repeat sponsorship.

Position Description

Job Title: Volunteer Sponsor Liaison

Reports to: Marketing and Promotions Department

Location:

Volunteer Sponsor Liaison can work from anywhere in the State, however head office is based in Launceston.

Key Responsibilities:

- Liaise with Tasmanian businesses to negotiate the donation of goods and services.
- Establish and maintain positive and professional relationships with sponsors as well as RSPCA staff and volunteers.
- Other duties as directed.

Personal Attributes:

- Professional presentation
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills
- Well-developed interpersonal and listening skills
- Ability to work closely to a "script"
- Ability to work with minimal supervision
- Commitment to the welfare of animals
- Ability to work in a team.

Age Requirements:

Minimum age is 18.

Length of Appointment:

The role of a Sponsor Liaison can be utilised throughout the year, however volunteers can elect a set time period or event. Typically, the period between May and August each year is a time of high need.

It is requested that a volunteer commits a minimum of four hours per week for a period of three months.



Time Commitment:

Volunteer Sponsor Liaisons can dedicate as much or as little as they wish. Generally, volunteers in this area will spend between 4 hours and 30 hours per week. Working hours depend heavily on the needs of the sponsor.

Support Provided:

Volunteers undertake a full orientation and training program. Senior Management is available at all times to assist, support or to resolve disputes.

RSPCA Tasmania is committed to providing a healthy and safe workplace for all volunteers with all practical resources available to ensure compliance with the statutory requirements for a risk-free workplace.
